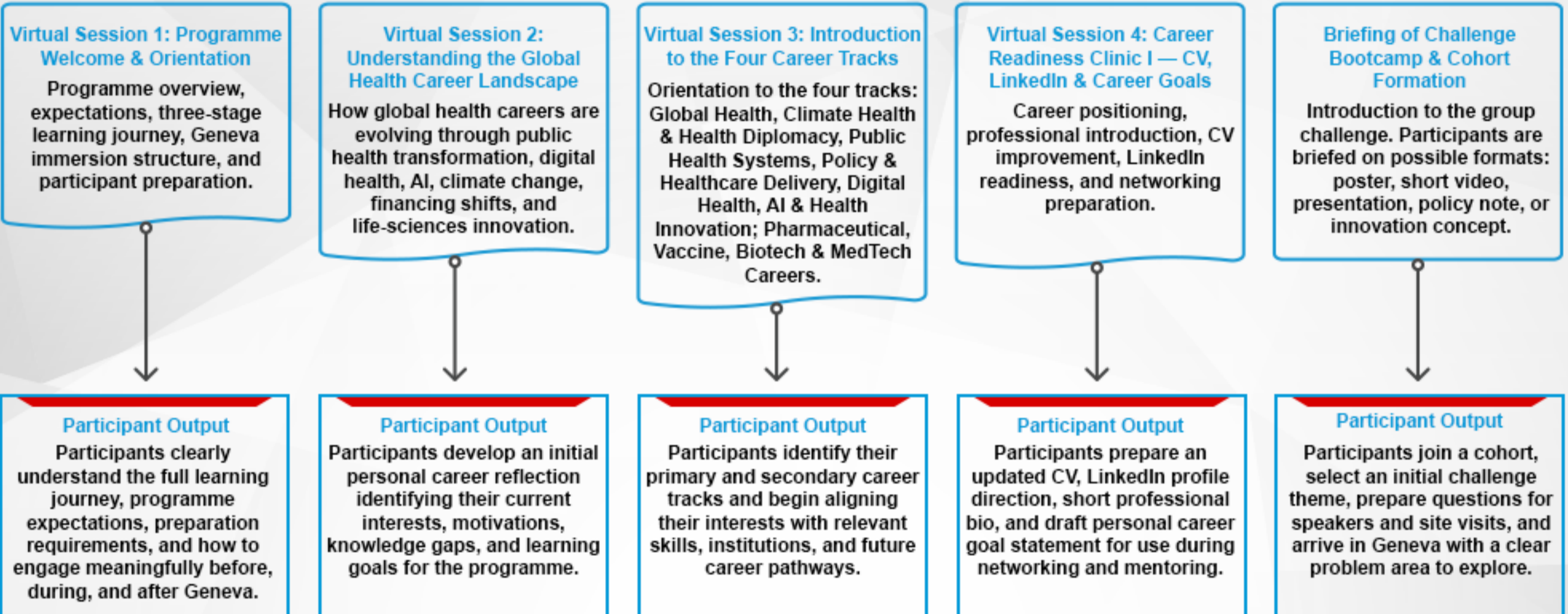

Stage 1: Before the Workshop — Online Preparation

Stage 2: Geneva Experience — 5-Day Immersive Workshop

Timeline	Session / Activity	High-Level Focus	Participant Output
Day 1 — Morning	Orientation to Geneva's Health Ecosystem	Registration, Opening session, workshop objectives, Geneva as a hub for global health, diplomacy, public health, innovation, and life sciences.	Participants understand the workshop flow, map their interests across the four tracks, and connect Geneva's ecosystem with their own career aspirations.
Day 1 — Afternoon	Technical Session I: Global Health, Climate Health & Health Diplomacy	Global health governance, climate-health linkages, donors, NGOs, health equity, health diplomacy & international development, career pathways in global health.	Participants identify key institutions, roles, skills, and entry pathways in global health, health diplomacy, international development, NGOs, donors, and UN-linked careers.
Day 2 — Morning	Technical Session II: Public Health Systems, Policy & Healthcare Delivery	Public health systems & policy foundations, healthcare delivery & implementation, health workforce & professional pathways and career pathways in public health.	Participants understand public health and healthcare delivery career pathways and identify how their background can connect to policy, implementation, research, and health systems roles.
Day 2 — Afternoon	Technical Session III: Digital Health, AI & Health Innovation	Digital health transformation, AI for health, digital health governance, healthtech innovation, entrepreneurship and careers in digital Health and AI.	Participants identify emerging opportunities in digital health, AI, data, healthtech, innovation, and entrepreneurship, and understand the skills needed to enter these pathways.
Day 3 — Morning	Technical Session IV: Pharma, Vaccines, Biotech & MedTech	Understanding the life sciences ecosystem, key functions across the value chain, access to medicines, vaccines & technologies and career pathways in life sciences.	Participants understand career opportunities across the life-sciences value chain, including pharma, vaccines, biotech, MedTech, access, procurement, regulatory, and supply-chain roles.
Day 3 — Afternoon	Cross-Cutting Skills, Leadership & Challenge Bootcamp	Leadership, teamwork, communication, storytelling, networking, collaboration, and applied challenge bootcamp.	Participants develop a structured group challenge output and strengthen leadership, teamwork, communication, storytelling, networking, and collaboration skills.

Stage 2: Geneva Experience — 5-Day Immersive Workshop

Timeline	Session / Activity	High-Level Focus	Participant Output
Day 4 — Morning Day 4 — Afternoon	Track-Based Site Visits — Geneva Health Ecosystem	Institutional exposure linked to the four health career tracks, institutional exposure followed by guided reflection on roles, skills, and career observations.	Participants observe real institutional environments, understand how organizations operate, document key career observations and identify practical career entry points, roles, and skill expectations.
Day 5 — First Half	Career Entry Pathways and Bootcamp challenge preparation	Career entry pathways across the Four Health Career tracks, individual career action planning, final cohort bootcamp presentations preparation, mentor feedback.	Participants refine their individual career action plans, strengthen final group outputs, receive mentor feedback, and prepare for final presentations and next-step planning.
Day 5 — Second Half	Challenge Bootcamp, Closing Ceremony & Way Forward	Final challenge presentations, closing reflections, recognition, certificate distribution, way-forward guidance, and transition into the post-workshop mentorship and alumni journey.	Participants present final outputs, receive feedback and recognition, complete the Geneva learning journey, and transition into the post-workshop mentorship and alumni pathway.

Stage 3: After the Workshop — Continued Growth

Timeline	Session / Activity	High-Level Focus	Participant Output
Within 1 week after Geneva	Virtual Session 1: Post-Workshop Reflection & Career Action Submission	Reflection on Geneva experience, site visits, technical sessions, and career direction.	Participants submit a refined individual career action plan based on technical sessions, site visits, mentor feedback, and personal career goals.
2 weeks after Geneva	Virtual Session 2: Career Coaching Clinic II — CV, LinkedIn & Applications	Refining CV, LinkedIn, career narrative, cover letters, and application readiness after the Geneva experience.	Participants finalize an improved CV, LinkedIn profile, career narrative, and draft application material tailored to their preferred career pathway.
4 weeks after Geneva	Virtual Session 3: UN, International Organizations & Global Health Career Pathways	Practical guidance on navigating career pathways in UN agencies, international organizations, NGOs, donors, and global health institutions.	Participants create a targeted shortlist of relevant organizations, roles, internships, fellowships, and application routes aligned with their career goals.
6 weeks after Geneva	Virtual Session 4: Mentorship Circles by Career Track	Track-specific mentorship aligned with participants' chosen areas of interest.	Participants receive track-specific mentor feedback and refine a practical career roadmap with priority actions for the next 3 months.
8 weeks after Geneva	Virtual Session 5: Opportunity Mapping & Networking Lab	Opportunity search strategy, and networking outreach.	Participants build a personalized opportunity tracker and networking action plan, including target contacts, deadlines, and follow-up actions.
10 weeks after Geneva	Alumni Showcase & Career Progress Review	Support selected teams in refining their workshop challenge outputs for wider visibility, partner engagement, or future development.	Participants share progress, refine selected challenge outputs for wider visibility, and update their career development plan based on feedback.
12 weeks after Geneva	Global Health Career Community & Alumni Engagement	Continued peer networking, opportunity sharing, mentor touchpoints, and alumni-led learning.	Participants remain engaged through peer networking, opportunity sharing, mentor touchpoints, and continued collaboration within the global health career community.
